GENERAL PARISH INFORMATION

BAPTISM: Infant Baptism Parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling a baptism and it is required that godparents also attend. Call the parish office to make arrangements.

MARRIAGE: Call the parish office and request a copy of the "Marriage Preparation Guideline". Make an appointment for an initial interview with a priest or deacon at least six months prior to the anticipated wedding date. There are several classes & workshops that the couple must attend.

RCIA: For those considering entry into the Catholic Church. Contact the church office at 678-7813 or email holynam@holynamchurch.org.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is administered both to the dying and to those who are ill or are about to undergo an operation, for the recovery of their health and for spiritual strength. It is a ritual of healing appropriate not only for physical but also for mental and spiritual sickness.

FUNERAL: When a loved one dies, it is a time of great stress and grief. Making a phone call to the pastor is an important first step. He can offer not only spiritual support but also practical guidance about what steps need to be taken next. Please call the parish office after contacting the Funeral Home.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Ministers of the Holy Eucharist bring communion to the homebound and hospitalized after the 8:00 a.m. Mass each Sunday. Call the parish office if you wish a priest, deacon or communion minister to visit the sick.

GIFTING THE PARISH: Please consider making a planned gift to Holy Name of Jesus Church such as a bequest in your will, gift of life insurance, or a charitable trust. All gifts are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law.

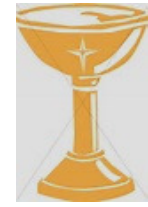

BURSE CLUB AND SEMINARIAN NEWS

BURSE CLUB. Thank you HNJ parishioners for using your blue Burse Club envelopes! In April the president of the Diocese Council of Catholic Women presented the annual Burse Club check for the education of our Seminarians to the Diocesan Administrator in the amount of \$206,860. This was the largest amount ever collected in one year. Of that amount, you, the generous HNJ parishioners, donated \$3,296! Since 1981, the Burse Clubs in the parishes of the PT Diocese have collected over \$4 million dollars for the Burse Club.

SEMINARIANS. In April, Seminarian Jack Campbell was ordained by Bishop Parks to the Transitional Diaconate, the last step prior to ordination as a priest. On June 3, Transitional Deacon Luke Farabaugh was ordained as a Priest by Bishop Parks.

There are currently 12 Seminarians, one of whom was accepted into the program in May 2017. Eight of the 12 are studying Theology at St Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach. The remaining four are studying pre-Theology at St John Vianney College Seminary in Miami. The new Seminarian 2017-2018 pamphlets are in the pews and the poster is on the bulletin board. Statement from our new Bishop-Elect Bill Wack, CSC

I am incredibly humbled by the Holy Father's appointment to serve the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee as bishop. Now I know for sure that God is merciful, having called this sinner to serve in this capacity. The first words which came to mind when I heard of the appointment were, "Lord I am not worthy ... but only say the Word..." With joy and zeal, I accept appointment, and I am thrilled to begin service to God's people as a bishop.

I have always loved being a priest. For me there is nothing higher than the privilege of celebrating the Eucharist and the other sacraments. Over the past 23 years I have grown tremendously in my faith, through the very mysteries I have served. As a priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross, I know of the power of the cross of Christ, and the hope that it brings to all creation. We in Holy Cross strive to be "educators in the faith" wherever we go, and I am happy to continue to do this in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee.

LIFE LINE SCREENING

Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Church is hosting Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings on Wednesday, June 21, 2017. The screenings provided focus on vascular disease, a leading cause of illness, death and disability among men. Screenings are fast, painless and affordable. Three key tests check for blocked carotid arteries, an irregular heart rhythm called atrial fibrillation, and high blood pressure, which are the three leading risk factors for stroke. Nearly 800,000 strokes will occur this year, taking a life approximately every four minutes. Other tests check for abdominal aortic aneurysms and hardening of the arteries in the legs. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women. Many events also offer blood tests, including cholesterol, glucose and c-reactive protein screenings, as well as take-home colon cancer early detection tests. Screening packages start at \$139. Single tests cost around \$70. Pre-registration is required.
