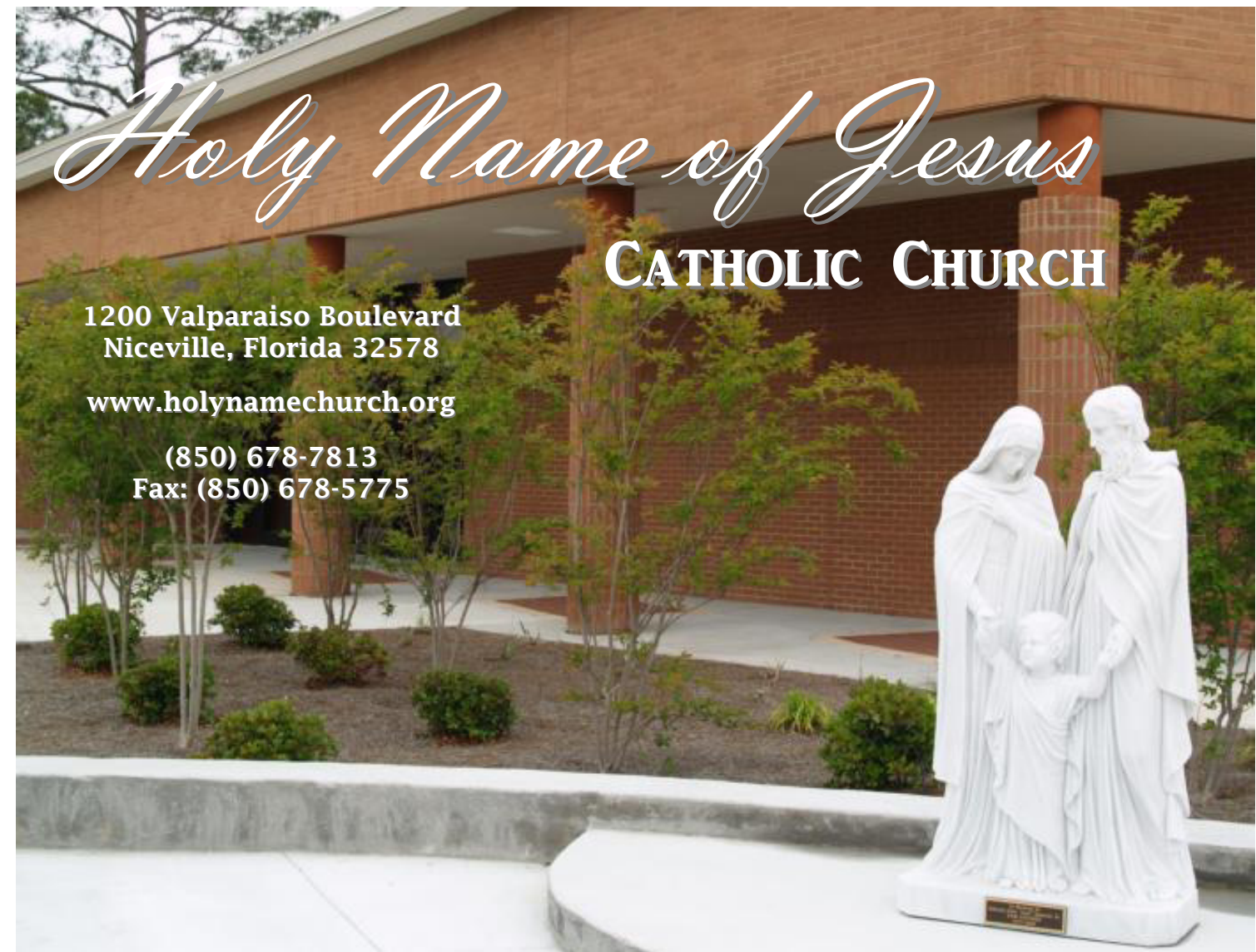

Dear Parents of PreK-5th Grade RE Students,

In keeping with the *U.S. Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Youth* our catechists will teach age-appropriate Abuse Prevention to all students PreK through 5th grade during the regular RE time period on SUNDAY, OCTOBER 29th. This session will cover some or all of the following 10 Objectives as outlined by our Diocese:

- Each human being is created in the image and likeness of God. Our bodies are sacred and holy.
- We are blessed with families and loving communities to help us grow.
- Because each person is made in the image of God, each person must be treated with dignity and respect. My body is a gift to me from God and deserving of respect.
- We must differentiate between safe, unsafe, and unwanted touch.
- The God-given gift of choice has consequences.
- Some actions or behaviors are wrong or sinful. Behavior or actions that harm self or others physically, psychologically, or spiritually are wrong.
- We must differentiate between good and bad play and avoid keeping secrets.
- Each of us experiences good and bad human relationships and friendships. Some people manipulate or misuse friendships.
